## **DISCONTINUED SUPPORT FOR WEBSYDIAN 3.1**

Websydian A/S provides support for two versions prior to the current version of Websydian. Therefore the support for Websydian 3.1 will discontinue on the 1<sup>st</sup> of March 2005, as a result of the coming release, Websydian "Dvalin". We encourage our customers to upgrade to the latest version in order to be able to get support, and take advantage of new features.

## DISTRIBUTED WEBSYDIAN ARCHITECTURE (DWA) DEPLOYMENT GUIDES
